'People with visual impairment are able to go, to move, to be, and to compete with all others in society. The means by which this is done is that simple tool, the white cane. With the growing use of the white cane is an added element—the wish and the will to be free—the unquenchable spirit and the inextinguishable determination to be independent. With these their lives are changed, and the prospects for blind people become bright. That is what White Cane Safety Day is all about. Government is taking considerable measures in the mainstreaming of persons with disabilities; Issuance of special ID cards for disabled persons and national plan of action based on national policy 2002 are landmarks of the efforts, on this day we pledge the implantation of the policy', said Mr. Imtiaz Qazi, Federal Secretary Ministry of Social Welfare and Special Education, while addressing the event organized by STEP to mark the International White Cane safety Day on October 14, 2009 in Islamabad. The event held at Auditorium of Pakistan National Council of Arts was attended by about 500 people from all walks of life including representatives of disabled peoples organizations, development sector, government, universities and media.
