Established on 03/12/2013, DRD is a non-governmental organization, non-profit and operated by people with disabilities (PWDs), for the rights of PWDs.

With many diverse activities such as introducing internships, employment, skills training, advocacy campaign, moving assistance, scholarships, computers devices, assistive devices, information consultation, peer counseling, propagations, seminars and events raising awareness on disability issues, ... DRD is rated as one of 20 non-governmental organizations efficiently operated in Vietnam and is the leading one in supporting the PWDs to integrate into the community.

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A day before International Women's Day

Sowing the joys from heart's flowers

In the thrilling days for wellcoming the International Women's day on March-8th, instead of choosing to go out with friends, walking pompously around the city like most young people, some of PWDs choose another way to "enjoy": Selling flowers for fundraising. They are members of the women with disabilities club, youth with disabilities of the Break-Through (Đột Phá) group and volunteers.

To prepare for the date, on Feb-16th, there was a skills sharing section for flower package, to know the basic rules of flower arrangements and to know how to wrap the flower bouquet, how to form the simplest flower basket that is usually chosen by the customer.

A few days before the feast, they started being busy with flower buying, flower arrangements and advertising on Facebook, to friends and to family, etc ... Supporting orders came impetuously. Volunteers cared deftly and meticulously to get a beautiful package and home delivery.

In the feast day, the Break-Through (Đột Phá) groups and many volunteers were split into two locations: opposite the Communist Youth Union of Ho Chi Minh City headquarter and a corner of rotation in front of Notre Dame Cathedral to sell the flowers.

The last bouquets were intended to be the gifts to the femele labors, femele street vendors in 30-4 park, creating little happiness for them. Even though the members of the group were very tired but they felt really happy and had more experiences.

This is the second selling round of the Break Through - Đột Phá group, after the day Oct-20th 2013 to raise funds to organize the Christmas Eve for children with disabilities. All money collected of the round for fundraising like this will be used to organize charity programs or activities of social significance.

She said that barriers from family's community's attitude, a unfriendly and inaccessible environment and even from inside of people with disabilities were factors that prevent their inclusion.

We will continue to cooperate with DRD in organizing the same activities for a bigger range of students." Mr. Nguyen Luu Bao Doan, the head of Equal Community Development Department said.

Lives worth living

“Lives Worth Living” was the title of the film directed by Neudel and Alison Gilkey. The film was newly screened in the Disability Research and Capacity Development Center (DRD) on Mar-12th 2014, under the support of the US Consulate in Hochiminh city. The program attracted more than 50 people with disabilities (PWDs), including students, journalists, etc... The activity was located in the sequence of events of Vietnamese-American culture exchange, deployed by the Consulate. The story showed the milestones of the struggles for equal rights movement of PWDs in the United States.

Mrs Alison Gilkey made everyone touched when she shared that the attitude of the people around the PWDs affects greatly to them: "As the mother of two sons with disabilities, I think I should pay more attention and action to mobilize, advocate for PWD's community. My son is going to graduate from an university for autistic people, and I will continue to accompany and assist my children to integrate into the social and to find a suitable job".

Master of Social Work Luu Thi Anh Loan (Vice Director of DRD) also gave the audience more information about the Disability Laws in Vietnam issued on Jan-1st, 2011 and the implementation of the Laws. She also shared: "DRD and its members are trying to promote equal opportunities for PWDs, encouraging and enabling PWDs to participate in all the activities like the others. When community have the right vision on the capacities and values of the PWDs, it will be easy to create equal opportunities for people with disabilities to participate in social activities. "

Three days to live independently at the coastal

On the first days of March, when the weather of Saigon is gradually becomes muggy, hot and sweltering, over 30 people (The program was held by Independent Living Project of the DRD, funded by the Nippon Foundation and the Japanese Human Care Association. It was a very new and fun experience, not only for the Independent Living delegation but also for all the 5 members of the travel company, because according to their sharing, it was the first time they were in charge of a trip with so many PWDs.

Nobody feels tired all the way of 220km from HCMC to Mui Ne. Three days and one night in Mui Ne, Phan Thiet, everyone had a time full of laughs and experiences.

On the way back, they visited Duc Thanh school where Uncle Ho previously taught. The members also interacted with PWDs working in the Sand Art workshops Phi Long. They built a good relationship and introduced the Independent Living Model that DRD was implementing. They shared the stories about the process of establishing this workshop and how make these famous sand picture products with each other.

Until 19:30 of Mar-3rd, all members came back to the city under our Great Uncle Ho's name, the exciting and fun trip ended.

The trip met initial requirements given "Love - Safety - Respect". Independent Living Project always guarantee their trips with more experiences and deserves to be looked forward and waited by any member!
